The book of quarto de Despejo: d'rios de um favelada, written by Caroline Maria de Jesus, was released that night by Francisco Alves, with 1,500 guests as witnesses to a remarkable episode for Brazilian literature. The work has just turned 60, being one of the best-selling Brazilian books, discussed and translated of all time. Caroline was discovered by journalist Auldio Dantas, who was sent to make an agenda on the favela-do-Caninda to show the poverty of the place on the banks of the River Tite. There he was surprised by the writings of this woman from the slums and returned with an offer to publish his texts in the newspaper Folha da Neut, one of the main examples of the capital of Sao Paulo. Excerpts from his diary were the report Drama of the favelas written by the slums, published in the same periodical in 1958. At the time, there were negative criticisms and comments about the publication in which the elite argued that it was impossible for a woman of this origin to write like this: Where already seen, a semi-literate black woman, and even if she was in the slums, write so, says one of the excerpts from the book Audio Reporting Time - Stories that marked time in Brazilian journalism (Leia). Time sent a special envoy to Brazil, David St. Clair, who came ready to show how Carolina had gone, from one moment to another, to live Cinderella's strange dream, said the journalist. At that time, the author was already read and discussed in the Globe. The quarto de Despejo was translated into 13 languages, sold in 40 countries and broke the mark of 1 million copies sold, even before the creation of Brazilian writers such as Jorge Amado and Paulo Coelho. The impressive diary, bringing Caroline fame, was a record of poverty. The diaries were written between 1955 and 1960. In them, the writer tells what life was like with three children, Joan Jose, Jose Carlos and Vera Unis, in favela-do-caninda, and their routine as a paper collector. Hunger was a recurring theme: Hunger is worse than that of alcohol. The dizziness of alcohol encourages us to sing. But hunger makes us tremble. I realized it was horrible to have only air inside the stomach. She was not married by choice, she said she could feed herself to her children. With work she managed to get out of the suburbs. The mining company, who was born in Sacramento in 1914, died at the age of 62 from respiratory failure in Palereyros, in the southern zone, in 1977. Despite her success in the work that brought her to peace in life, Caroline did not enjoy the recognition of her work for a long time.
